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Fayemi to construct 450m road for FUOYE

The Governor of Ekiti State, Dr Kayode Fayemi has approved the construction of a 450-meter road from Central Administration to the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences within the campus of Federal University Oye-Ekiti.

This revelation was made by the Vice-Chancellor of the University in his Office on Tuesday November 12, 2019 while answering questions from Ekiti State Correspondent of Television Continental (TVC) Mr Ayomide Ajeigbe in the presence of reporters from FUOYENews.

According to Prof Kayode Soremekun, by this gracious intervention of the state government, the University roads will form a circle and thus open up more areas for development.

Speaking further, the Vice-Chancellor disclosed that three more faculties are in the offing and will soon start admitting students. "Our Law Programme, which has been approved by the National Universities Commission (NUC) is waiting for concurrent approval of the Council of Legal Education (CLE) to take off", he said.

made this revelation on Tuesday, November 12, 2019 while answering questions from FUOYENews team and Television Continental (TVC) Correspondent at Ado Ekiti, Mr. Ayomide Ajeigbe.

According to the Vice-Chancellor of the institution, Prof

Kayode Soremekun, "siblings of the two students who lost their lives in that riot but want to study at this university, will be on scholarship throughout their stay here.....Also, those who were injured, will not pay tuition"

(FUOYE), has expressed appreciation to the management of the school for their tireless efforts to provide necessary infrastructure in the university. The Accreditation team comprising Prof Oseghale Efosa Bendrift from Ambrose Alli University, Oye Ekiti

Prof Noah Echa Attah from Federal University of Kashere, Gombe State and Mrs Unuigbe Favour as Secretary visited the Vice-Chancellor, Prof Kayode Soremekun, in his office on Thursday November 7, 2019 after an evaluation tour. Speaking during an exit courtesy visit, Prof Thomas, who led the

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to show empathy and identify with these people in this trying period”, he further said.

Earlier, on Wednesday November 6, 2019 during an interactive meeting with a cross section of students preparatory to the resumption of academics activities at the Conference Room of the Student Affairs Division, the Vice Chancellor, who was represented by Deputy Vice Chancellor, Professor Olusola Johnson Ojo said the meeting was to update the students on the readiness of the University Management to smoothly resume academic activities sequel to stakeholders' intervention over suspension of academic activities about two months ago.

“This administration had investigated the unfortunate episode and will continuously explore ways to stem future spontaneous student demonstrations”, he said adding that, “ among other things, the University Management has been talking with the families of the

deceased students and has resolved to offer scholarships to the siblings (of the two) who could want to study in the University and to also waive tuition fees for those who were injured during the crisis”.

He equally revealed that Students' Union activities will be allowed in the institution upon resumption but noted that the Executive Council of the Students Union who authorized the riot in violation of Students' Union Constitution by sidelining the Students Representative Council (SRC) leadership has been dissolved.

Professor Ojo further said that although the investigative panel prescribed various punitive measures for those found culpable, the management has, however magnanimously shelved all the measures to allow all the students pursue their academics desires and for the institution to move ahead.

“The dissolution of the Executive Council of the Students Union is the least irreducible minimum management can do in

terms of being lenient as the Investigative Panel that looked into the incident recommended stricter measures”, he further said.

Also speaking at the meeting, the Dean of the Student Affairs (DSA), Dr. Dosu Malomo said all decisions taken by the university are as a result of what he termed “doctrine of necessity”.

According to the DSA, the various Presidents of the Faculties are being considered in the interim to replace the dissolved Executive Council but the Students Representative Council will continue to function.

He assured that modalities provided for in the constitution of the Students' Union for an Electoral Committee that will conduct elections for a new Executive Council will be followed more so that tenure of the dissolved executives was almost ending.

The session equally featured questions from the students with response from the university management team present.

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“Also, the Faculty of Pharmacy is 100% ready with structures and facilities now available. We are waiting for approval from the Pharmacist Society of Nigeria (PSN) to commence academic activities”, the Vice-Chancellor said.

Again, the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences (BMS) is 85% completed. The Faculty will house programmes like Nursing, Anatomy, Physiology, Radiography etc. “This will make FUOYE the second university in

the South Western Zone of Nigeria offering Radiography Programme”, he further said.

Typical of a mini stewardship report, Prof Soremekun recalled a distant past when the University portal was domiciled in another university and disclosed that FUOYE has since past that stage. “We now have our own portal here in FUOYE and efforts are on to make it even more wholesome and vibrant”, he stressed.

Furthermore, the

University now has 450 students capacity science laboratory upgraded from the previous 50 students capacity science laboratory. Students' population has increased from 510 at inception to 17,000 now. With the coming of the three faculties, that is, Law, Pharmacy and Basic Medical Sciences, the students' population is sure to grow more and our quest for additional facilities will keep rising.

He then charged the students to remain focused.



Soremekun tasks Road Safety on Ekiti roads

The Vice Chancellor, Federal University, Oye Ekiti (FUOYE), Prof Kayode Shoremekun has called on the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) to pay more attention to the state of Nigerian roads particularly, Ekiti State.

Prof Shoremekun, who made this statement during a courtesy visit of the Ekiti State Command of the Road Safety Corps on Wednesday November 6, 2019 at his office in Oye Ekiti, also appreciated the good work of the federal agency.

“FRSC is doing good work. You have what we can call proactive approach to saving lives. However, you cannot be effective if our roads are in bad shapes”, he said.

“From Oye to Ifaki, you will see dark spots. Again, from Ifaki to Iworoko, you will see dark spots too. FRSC should show more interest on maintenance of our roads” he stressed pointing out that we all travel to other countries and we all see what operate there.

Responding, the Corp Commandant, Ekiti State Command of the Corp, Mrs F.O. Alegbe said, “we always want to identify with higher institutions because we have many young ones there”. We want to sensitize

them on the pros and cons of using highway. We want to call attention to dangers of using phones while driving”, she added.

According to the Corp Commandant who led Assistant Corp Commandant, T.O. Abioye; Route Commandant S.I. Mama; Deputy Route Commandant R. Owolabi; Deputy Route Commandant D.I. Balogun; and Assistant Route Commandant O.S. Campbell to the Vice Chancellor, “there is serious need to register our vehicles”.

“We normally interact with schools. We want situation where schools have Safety Managers. All vehicles must have valid particulars. These are why we are here to educate people”, she said, adding that, “we involve ourselves in public enlightenment campaign. We want to talk to our students to desist from doing driver's license by proxy”..

The Vice Chancellor further disclosed that FUOYE don't reject any student no matter how bad. “If you are not qualified to go through Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB), you will consider Pre-degree”, he disclosed and added that even Joint Universities Preliminary Examination Board (JUPEB) is there. Through JUPEB, you can enter into 200 Level the following year.

Again there is the Distance Learning Programme with globally recognised pioneer Vice-Chancellor of National Open University (NOUN), Prof Jegede as our Director. “Distance Learning is a legitimate instrument to acquire additional qualifications. In places like South Africa or Canada, it is a common method of advancing career”, he stressed.

“You can introduce it to your staff, Prof Shoremekun further suggested disclosing that he just visited the globally recognised Centre for Open Learning (COL) in Vancouver, Canada recently”.

The Vice Chancellor again added that, “we have initiated Top Up Programme. This is to help remove psychological feelings of those with Higher National Diploma (HND). We are saying we can bridge the gap between HND and first degree. Already seven polytechnics have enlisted in the programme including Yabatech, Ibadanpoly etc... and we have in place a good and tested quality assurance programme to be sure any of our degree is globally acceptable.

NUC accreditation team commends FUOYE on programme

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Speaking during an exit courtesy visit, Prof Thomas, who led the delegation said, “the university environment is very friendly, class rooms and toilets are functional; it shows a very good commitment and proficiency towards this accreditation. The visiting don also noted management efforts at putting in place quality e-library but advised to create more space for Nigerian journals both in the manual library and e-library”.

Professor Bingel, further said that the tests and measurements of certain courses are okay and encouraged the management to seek for more Senior Lectures and Professors in areas that are lacking.

Responding, the Vice-

Chancellor, Prof Shoremekun thanked NUC and the visiting professor calling their task “a national assignment”

“Your task is a national assignment to enforce quality control in education amongst tertiary institutions in Nigeria. It is a very important process in quality control mechanism for Nigerian degrees. I appreciate you for your fairness. Thanks both for the commendations and the advice. We will do more in the areas you noted are weak”, he further said.

As soon as the 2020 budget becomes operational, we will channel our energies to those areas you want us to attend to so that by the time you visit us again, you will notice some progress again, he stressed adding that the

university administration will leave no stone unturned to ensure that standard is not compromised.

More NUC Accreditation teams praise FUOYE

All the four accreditation teams from the National Universities Commission (NUC) who visited the faculty of Management Sciences at the Federal University, Oye Ekiti have expressed satisfaction with academic activities at the faculty.

The Academic programme evaluators, who inspected four academic programmes in Accounting, Banking and Finance, Business Administration and Public Administration during their visit to the university on Friday November 15, 2019 gave their nods to all these programmes.

This is after screening the programmes philosophy and objectives, the curricular, academic regulations and awareness of same among staff and students, course evaluation systems, available facilities, staffing, admission process and more.

The teams are led by Prof Emma Okoye of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka (Accounting), Prof Osuka Benard of Imo State University, Owerri (Banking and Finance), Prof Aminu Kado Kurfi, Bayero University, Kano (Business Administration) and Prof Walter Obi Ezedili (Public Administration).

Presenting their findings in Accounting Programme, Prof Okoye said, "The philosophy and objectives of the programme is well defined. Curriculum is adequate. Academic regulations are clearly defined. Course evaluation system is in place and of good standard. Available physical facility is high and an External Examiner system is established" and added however that, the university should improve on the internet access.

Prof Kurfi's team to Banking and Finance had similar story to tell. "Curriculum of studies is adequate. Academic regulations exist. Students are aware of these regulations because we interacted with them. Course content and learning materials are adequate and even before the students are promoted to 400Level, External Examiners have been appointed".

"The seriousness of FUOYE staff and students is clear to us. The academic ratio is adequate because more than 60% of staff has PhD and the *esprit de'corp* among staff is high. One particular student told us he is aiming at first class", the professor added.

Speaking for Public Administration programme, Prof Benard explained, "We are here for peer review. We want to build bridges across universities each time we come for accreditation exercise. We are quite satisfied with what we saw and have highlighted areas where opportunities exist to develop", Prof Benard said, adding that "this is a young but growing university".



55 million e-books available in FUIOYE e-library -NUC Accreditation team leader

No fewer than 55million e-books are available and accessible at the electronic library of the Federal University, Oye Ekiti, a university don has said.

The National Universities Commission (NUC) Accreditation team leader for Criminology and Security Studies programme to the Faculty of Social Sciences of the university, Prof Chika Umar Aliyu from Usman Dan Fodio University, Sokoto made this disclosure on Tuesday November 19, 2019 while on accreditation visit along with three others.

The other three who came with Prof Aliyu on the accreditation exercise are: Prof Julius O. Onwuka of Abia State University, Prof Musa Haruna Buba and Mr Nazif Jamilu Suleiman.

According to him, “in terms of electronic materials, we are happy to find over 55million e-books in your e-library. I browsed this myself” adding that “You have all the gadgets and we are happy with you sir”

Speaking in similar vein, Prof (Mrs) Chinyere Stella Okunna who led others to evaluate the Mass Communication programme of the university revealed that, “with the ongoing unbundling of Mass Communication programme, you won’t be teaching Mass Communication as a course but as seven courses”

“We have seen the handbook and what we have there is very commendable. Admission requirement is good. The students we met are happy with the programme”, she further disclosed saying that eleven out of twelve lecturers in the department have PhD. That is excellent she added.

Prof Okunna continues, “On physical facilities, you have seven of them. They are acceptable. Your demonstration Radio studio and your Television studio are good. We saw your PRAD laboratory, it is very good and functional. The library is okay in number and quality”, she further noted canvassing for more local content at the library.

The Vice Chancellor, Professor Kayode Soremekun, who received their reports, thanked the visiting delegates and promised to even do more

FUOYE APPOINTS NEW DEPUTY VICE-CHANCELLOR, 3 OTHERS

This is to announce the appointment of an Ekiti born Professor of Geology, Olusola Johnson Ojo as the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic) of the Federal University Oye Ekiti (FUOYE) and three other Senior University Staff.

The three other university staff are; Prof Pius Adebayo Araoye as Director of Research; Mr Mufutau Adesina Ibrahim as acting Registrar and Mr Jolaolu Adeyinka Ademuyiwa as Deputy Director, Corporate Services.

These appointments are made to strengthen the administration of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof Kayode Shoremekun and avoid any vacuum even as the school prepares for resumption activities.

Prof Ojo, who graduated from University of Ilorin (1989) with B.Sc degree in Geology; University of Ibadan (1992) with Masters degree in Petroleum Geology and Sedimentology and again from University of Ilorin (2000) with P.hD degree in Geology is a DAAD Award doctoral research winner in 2001.

Prior to his recent appointment, the Ikole-Ekiti professor had worked in several capacities in the university. For instance, he was Head of Department of Geology (2015-2019); Chairman, University Examination and Time Table Committee (2018-date); Chairman Students Disciplinary

Committee (2018-date) and also a member of the Governing Council since 2018.

As DVC-Acad, he will support the administration's desire for academic stability, internal quality control, and seamless learning and teaching experience for students and teachers respectively.
